FAMILY SEATED AROUND A TABLE. THE GRANDPARENTS ARE POISED TO SET DOWN A ROASTED TURKEY, JUST OUT OF THE OVEN. THE IMAGE REPRESENTS ROCKWELL'S VISION OF 'FREEDOM FROM WANT', PART OF HIS FAMOUS DEPRESSIONERA SERIES FOR THE SATURDAY EVENING POST KNOWN AS THE FOUR FREEDOMS.

IN ROCKWELL"S RENDERING, THE FAMILY APPEARS TO BE ON THE VERGE OF RECITING A BLESSING. THE SCENE SEEMS TO SPRING OUT OF LONG-AGO PAST. WITH AFTER-SCHOOL SPORTS EVENING MEETINGS, AND BOTH PARENTS WORKING LONG HOURS, FEW FAMILIES ARE ABLE TO SIT DOWN TO DINNER AT THE SAME TIME, LET ALONE OFFER A BLESSING TOGETHER.

THE SIMPLE ACT OF GIVING AND RECEIVING BLESSING IS BECOMING A LOST ART. IT'S UP TO US CHRISTIANS TO FIND THE COURAGE TO RESET THE EXAMPLE IN DAY TO DAY LIFE EXPERIENCES.

I THOUGHT OF HOW EVEN SEEMINGLY MUNDANE ACTS LIKE PLANTING A GARDEN ARE CELEBRATED AND RECITING THE SIMPLE PRASE "THANKS BE TO GOD" IS ENHANCING OUR WELLBEING IN LIFE. AS WENDELL BERRY SAYS IN HIS POEM" HOW TO BE A POET", THERE ARE NO UNSACRED PLACES, 'ONLY SACRED AND DESECRATED PLACES.'

WHEN WE OFFER BLESSINGS, IT IS A WAY OF EXPRESSING BOTH AWE AND THANKSGIVING FOR THE WORLD WE LIVE IN.
